


My Body

My body is a living machine. It has two types of organs. One you can see from outside and the others are located inside my body which cannot be seen.

The outside parts are called as **External Organs.** The head, the arms, the legs, the eyes, the ears, the nose and the tongue are our external organs. You know about all these external organs.

The Internal Organs are:



Brain: It is in our head. It helps us to think.



Heart: It is in our chest. It sends blood to the whole body. It never stops.



Lungs: There are two lungs in our chest. They help us to breathe.



Kidney: They are two kidneys in our body. They remove waste (urine) from our body.



Stomach: The stomach looks like a bag. It helps to change the food into liquid.

Our Sense Organs

We have five sense organs.

- 3. Our ears help us to hear.
- 4. Our tongue helps us to taste.
- 5. Our skin helps us to feel hot and cold.




Types of Clothes

We wear clothes according to seasons. We like to cover most of our body in winter. **Woollen clothes** keep us warm. Woollen clothes are made of wool. We get wool from sheep.



In summer season, we like to wear **cotton clothes**. Cotton clothes are light and keep us cool. Cotton is obtained from cotton plant.






Rubber clothes: In the rainy season, we wear a rain-coat and shoes made from rubber or plastic. They protect us from rain. We use an umbrella.



Silk clothes : On special occasions, we wear silk clothes. Silk is soft and shiny. We get silk from silk-worm.


Cotton, silk and wool are natural fibres. We also wear clothes made from manmade fibres like plastic, rayon and nylon.
